We gave out red envelopes




Acted out the Chinese zodiac story









## Year 2

#### Year 4 Fire Safety Workshop

Pupils from Year 4 participated in an informative and extremely useful Fire Safety Workshop delivered by officers based at Haden Cross Fire Station.

The pupils were taught about fire and its dangers:

- Actions to take in the event of a fire;
- Thinking about a route out of the house in the event of a fire;
- Importance of smoke alarms;
- Calling 999 for help and hoax calls;
- Potential fire hazards in the home;
- The 'Stop, Drop and Roll' method;




#### **Spellings**

This month, Year 3 and 4 have been busy bees practicing this new spelling rules. They have enjoyed watch Sir Linkalot videos to learn tricky words and collecting points on EdShed when completing their spelling assignments. They have absolutely smashed their spellings and should be buzzing with excitement.

#### History

The three classes have travelled back in time to explore the Roman Empire's invasion on Britain. The children have been fantastic history detectives when using sources to answer key questions such as 'what impact did the Romans have on Britain's settlements? and 'What resources did Britain have to offer the Romans?'.





## Year 5

In Year 5 we have been exploring the phases of the Moon. The children were able to recreate the Moon's orbit around Earth, where the angle between the Earth, Moon and Sun changes, giving us the phases of the Moon. They could use scientific vocabulary to describe each phase and explain what causes the changes. Great work from our super scientists!



This week in Art, 5M have been creating a colour-palette from a painting. They used Claude Monet's series of paintings, 'Haystacks' as inspiration and using watercolour, were able to mix colours to create their own colour pallet representing the colours depicted in their chosen painting. As you can see, they thoroughly enjoyed developing the skills of colour mixing and learnt how to load and hold their paintbrush correctly.







At Lapal, we are continually investing in technology to support our children's learning.

Our Digital Leaders held the grand unveiling of our new mobile device trolley, full to the brim of brand-new Chromebooks. As we now have so many trolleys in school, our Digital Leaders were tasked with the job of naming them after important role models from the world of computing, past and present.

After much research, the Digital Leaders used Google Classroom to cast their votes, deciding on naming the trolley's after:

- Alan Turing A British mathematician, who influenced computer science, artificial intelligence, and the outcome of World War II
- Grace Hopper A Rear Admiral in the US Navy and pioneering computer scientist, who invented the first computer language
- Elon Musk A South African businessman and owner of Tesla, Twitter and Space X
- Katherine Johnson The American mathematician often called 'The Human Computer', who helped send astronauts to the moon.

At Lapal, we celebrate diversity, so as a result, the Digital Leaders carefully selected these inspirational role models to show all children that people from different backgrounds, cultures and genders can be successful in the world of technology in the future. Also, so that we can learn more about the history of computing. Each trolley carries a QR code that can be scanned to take the user to useful website containing interesting facts, images and videos, so that we can all learn more about their achievements. For example, did you know that Grace Hopper coined the term 'bug' after she found a moth inside a computer that was no longer working?

Our Digital Leader's next project is to open their very own 'Genius Bar' where they will be the experts, passing on their knowledge to others of how to scan QR codes amongst many other things.

If your child is ill or unable to attend school, could we please remind parents to either leave a message on the school absence line or call the main office before 9:30am on each day of absence.


If a call is not received by this time then the school office, will call key contacts for an update.
