
Parliament Week

Year 3 and 4

Year 4 Maths Challenge

Year 4 pupils from our school represented Lapal at The King Edward's School Borcherds Shield Year 4 Mathematics Challenge. Teams of pupils from ten different primary schools participated in this heat. The first round involved answering Maths crossword questions based on their Maths knowledge and in the second round, they were faced with problemsolving and reasoning questions.

Our pupils showed good teamwork, speed and perseverance and received certificates from KES for their determination in Maths. Well done!



Times Tables Rockstars Battle

A huge well done to Years 3 and 4 for performing brilliantly well in the recent Battle of the Bands schools' battle. Year 4 did astoundingly well, coming in the top 5 classes across seven schools. KS2 Times Tables Champions!

From November 14th to 18th, our Key Stage Two children took part in a times table competition. They competed against 6 other schools and won!

Our outstanding Key Stage Two team achieved the highest average score (2, 692) and the highest number of correct answers (an impressive 573, 406 points!).

Year 5

In Year 5 we are exploring the refugee story, The Journey by Francesca Sanna. The children have demonstrated the Lapal values of kindness and respect when following the fictional account of one family escaping a war zone to find safety in another country. During our experience day we explored some real-life experiences of children who have been forced to leave their homeland due to the conflict in Ukraine. The children shared their thoughts and feelings about the experiences of other children, demonstrating empathy and compassion. The children were asked to bring in small items of great sentiment that they would take if they had to go on a journey, like the characters in the text. In role play and discussion they were able to 'put themselves in the shoes' of others, by considering how they might feel to loose precious belongings. It was a valuable lesson, building powerful vocabulary and deeper understanding of the experiences of others around the world.







Year 6

As part of our DT project, year 6, have used all of our skills builders to follow a basic bread recipe. We worked together as a team to make sure we followed each step of the recipe correctly. After the bread had proved over lunch, we placed it in the oven in our school kitchen. When it had cooled down, we evaluated the end product. To do this, we thought about the appearance, taste and texture of the bread and if it would be suitable for our elderly community at Gower Gardens.
