Dear Parents/Carers,

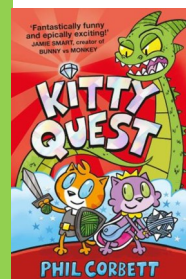
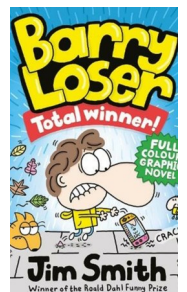

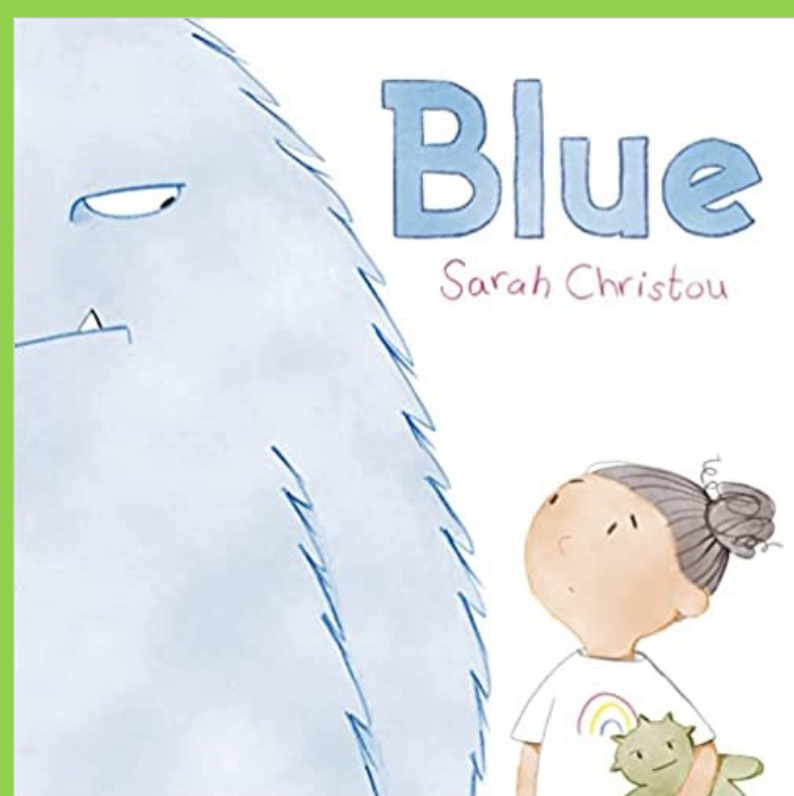


Blue

A Most Daring Escape

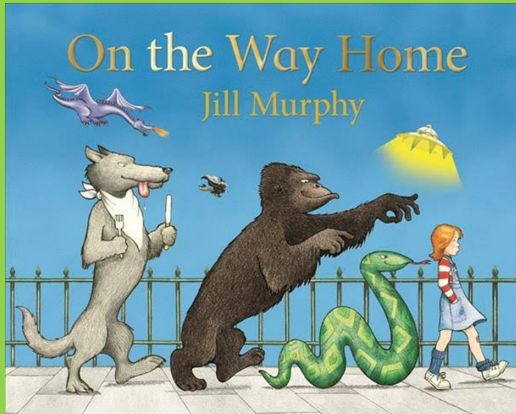

"Can't we go any faster?" a man with long, black locs called to the two other figures inside the driver's cab. "Lahiri?"

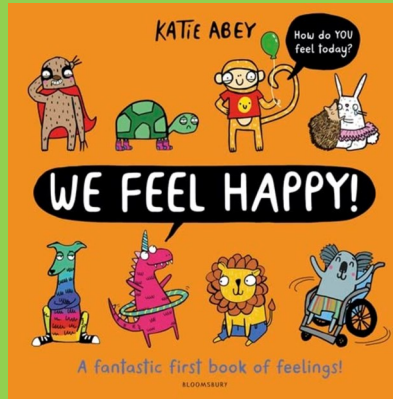
