Year 1

Firefighter Visit!

Year 1 were extremely lucky to receive a visit from some local firefighters this week. All of the children had the chance to sit inside and look around the fire engine and try on an oxygen mask and helmet. The children also had the opportunity to help Firefighter Ian use the big hose from the fire engine to put out a pretend fire. We then had the chance to look around the fire engine and were shown lots of different tools, ladders and hoses that are carried on the fire engine ready for any emergencies they have to attend. Finally, Mrs Clarke tried on a full fire fighters uniform including boots, trousers, jacket, hood, helmet, oxygen tank and mask and we learnt all about how these items keep the firefighters protected from fires.

Just before the firefighters left school they turned on the blue flashing lights and the siren which was very loud but very exciting!





Year 2

The Gunpowder Plot

Year two have been enjoying learning all about The Gunpowder plot in History. They have learnt about who Guy Fawkes was and his role in the plot. They have looked at the main events and thought about what might have been said and how people would have felt. They had a fun lesson acting out the plot using masks, each group practised role playing a particular event and then they acted out their part to build the whole sequence of events.





We have been listening to Winter form The Four Seasons composed by Vivaldi.

The children have explored how the sounds and instruments make us think of swirling snowflakes, Icicles and ice skating. The children also learnt that Vivaldi wrote his concerto for the violin. All of the children had a chance to explore the instrument and even have a go at playing it! We have a lot of budding violinists in year 2!

Year 3 and 4

This month, Year 3 and 4 have dived into the delicious world of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory'. To kick off the English, each child took the role of Charlie as they eagerly opened up their Wonka Bar to find a possible golden ticket! They had a fantastic time developing their vocabulary by exploring their sense during our feely bag activity and up leveling their words using a thesaurus.







Year 5


In PE Year 5 have been working hard in boot camp, they have been improving their stamina and having lots of fun completing a range of circuit-based training activities.






In Science Year 5 have been exploring the properties of natural and man-made materials. We carried out an investigation to find out which materials were conductors of

electricity and which were insulators, by creating an electrical circuit and observing the results. The results were very exciting and children were thinking like scientists by asking questions such as: does the shape of the material effect whether it is a better conductor? They were able to test their theories and surprised themselves!





Year 6

Science

In our first Science unit, we have been experimenting with forces. We discussed the term gravity and the im- Where do we see friction in action? pact it has on the world as well as wider forces including How can we overcome friction? air and water resistance and friction. We have completed a range of investigations to answer our scientific questions.



When is friction helpful and when is it a nuisance?

English

During our first writing unit, the children have focussed on the text, Kensuke's Kingdom. They all wrote entries in the Ships' Log. We used a range of skills including: similes, metaphors, fronted adverbials and imagery. We used some wonderful examples of this to create a display in the corridor.
