
Year 2

Our little historians blew us away with their knowledge and understanding of The Gunpowder Plot throughout our day at Coughton Court. The children answered some tricky questions in great detail, including the plotters names, dates, the reasons behind the plot and how we remember The Gunpowder Plot today.

The children listened to all of our tour guides as they shared stories and they asked such fantastic questions which aided their understanding of the links between The Gunpowder Plot and Henry VIII. Fantastic historical enquiry, well done year two!

The children also represented our school beautifully. They demonstrated our school values throughout the day and all of the volunteers commented upon their super manners, kindness and enthusiasm for learning. We are incredibly proud of you, year two. Well done!





Year 3 and 4

October has been a very busy month for Year 3 and 4. They had a fantastic time during the History Trip as they explored the village of Bournville whilst completing a quiz at each landmark followed by a tour around Cadbury World where they discovered how chocolate is made, got the opportunity to write their names in chocolate and completed a workshop lead by the Cadbury World education team.





Each class had continued to develop the love of reading with book brags whereby the children brought in and showcased their favourite book, giving explanations on why they liked it and who they would recommend it for.

Year 5

The Black Country Museum

This term, Year 5 had an incredibly fun-packed and memorable trip to the Black Country Living Museum. The children participated in a number of activities, including rag-rug making and experiencing school as a child in the Victorian times. After meeting some local 'residents' who showed us around their houses, they gathered a greater understanding of daily life during and following the industrial revolution. The meandering cobbled streets filled with shops frozen in time gave children the chance to meet chemists, sweet-shop owners and bakers from the Edwardian times. They also saw an entertaining demonstration of chain-making, walked along 'the cut' upon which, much of the black-country's trade was transported and learnt more about the mining industry, through exploring the workings of a colliery and mine-shaft. It was a highly educational, enjoyable day and we couldn't be prouder of our well-behaved and respectful pupils.









Year 6

Cannock Chase Museum

This month, Year 6 children travelled to Cannock Chase Museum to experience a World War II day. We had a fantastic day exploring artefacts and discovering what life was really like during that time. The children found out many fascinating facts including that families ate Sheep head broth (they didn't like the sound of it).

The children also had many dram opportunities and were given the chance to role play many scenarios that children faced during the war and in particular the process of evacuation. Through this, the children learnt how some children were fortunate with the families they were chosen by and others were not.

Finally, the children were able to hear the deafening noise of the warning siren and were asked to hid under the available tables when the noise was made. Overall it was a fantastic trip which the children thoroughly enjoyed.

Over the last two days, 6W have enjoyed learning how to stay safe whilst riding their bikes on the road. Thursday
