
Dear Parents/Carers,




This beautiful quote from Walt Disney reminds us of the power reading can have and that to a child, finding the right book, can be just like finding gold.




Shine like Stars


You are part of this earth. You grow like the seed, You shine like the stars.


Reconnect with the natural world with illustrations from British Book Award and Waterstones Children's Book Prize-winning illustrator Harry Woodgate.

Told from the point of view of the natural world, this exquisite and thought-provoking story from children's author Anna Wilson invites us to connect with the world around us and achieve our potential.








