Year 1

Year One enjoyed thoroughly enjoyed their trip to the Botanical Gardens and Glasshouses last week. In the morning they spent some time exploring the range of plants which were growing in the glasshouses and sketched some of these. After lunch they enjoyed some time playing in the ground in the glorious sunshine. Then after lunch the children attended an interactive 'Growth' workshop where they learnt lots of facts as well as having lots of fun!





Year 2

We had a wonderful time on our Trip to the West Midlands Safari Park. The children have been excellent Lapal ambassadors, showing just how well behaved and polite we are! We were very lucky to be able to spot so many different animals on our Safari, which was made even more exciting by being on a double decker bus! The children had maps of the park to follow and questions to answer for their teachers. They were fantastic at using this to identify the route, amount of animals spotted and whether they originate from the continents of Africa or Asia.

After lunch we had an explore around the park, looking at various reptiles and animals found in Africa. We then met our African Walking guides who were very impressed with our Geographical knowledge on Africa. It was great to see the African village and learn about how mud huts were made. We also learnt lots about native African animals including meerkats, Lemurs and Hippos.

To finish we managed to explore other parts of the park including the Tiger trail, African animal trail and even had a quick look at the dinosaurs before we left. We had lots of happy and tired children on the journey home.









Year 6

In Year 6 this month, we have started our new DT unit of 'Using Computer Aided Design' with a focus of Designer bags. The children have created mood boards by using Google Docs and have begun to practise a range of sewing techniques. This includes Running stitch and backstitch.



Alongside this, we have continued our work on All Around the World. We have focussed on lines of longitude and latitude and how they help support us when looking at the world.
