End of Year Uniform Reminder

- Pupils in EYFS and KS1 only require a **book bag** to transport their reading book and planner to and from school. Pupils who bring a packed lunch can bring a **small lunchbox/bag**.
- KS2 pupils may bring their **own bags** and **stationery equipment**. Please be mindful that bags and coats all need to be stored in drawer space provided so we recommended that bags are **not excessive in size**. Children only need a **small pencil case**, if they are too large then they take up too much desk space and prevent the children from being able to work effectively. Children will be asked to leave pencil cases at home if they are too large. If you do choose to provide your child with stationery the following items are used in school, glue stick, HB pencil, small plastic ruler, pencil sharpener, rubber, highlighter pen, colouring pencils (no felt tips). Blue pens will be provided to children once they have achieved their pen licence.
- We do not allow hairstyles with lines or patterns cut into the head or bright, artificial colours. If your child has had this type of cut/colour during the holidays, then can you please ensure school policy is met upon their return to school.
- For children who have had their ears pierced during the holidays they need to be able to **remove any stud earrings for P.E, including swimming.** Please can you practice this with the children as it is not acceptable for them not to take part in P.E. If they are unable to do so we will require them to be removed on the morning before coming into school or an adult to visit school to do this at lunchtime. **Staff are not allowed to do this for the children.**
- P.E lessons will commence from the first full week back in school. Swimming for Year 6 will begin on Thursday 11th September. Further details regarding P.E days will be communicated by the class teacher. We will continue to ask children to come to school dressed in P.E kit on their P.E days. This ensures that we make maximum use of the allocated P.E time.

Children can return to school in September in their summer uniform up until October half term (weather per mitting).

Summer Uniform

- White Polo t-shirt (logo or plain)
- Grey shorts/trousers/skirt/pinafore
- Gingham dress
- Logo jumper/cardigan
- Sensible black shoes (no trainers or open toed shoes or sandals)
- Grey or white socks

Winter Uniform

- White shirt/blouse
- School Tie (from Year 1 up)
- School Logo sweatshirt/cardigan
- Grey trousers/skirt/pinafore
- Sensible black shoes (no trainers or open toed shoes or sandals)
- Grey or white socks

P.E.

- Red logo t-shirt
- Black shorts/cycling shorts
- Pumps/trainers

During the colder months you may wish your child to also have <u>plain</u> black tracksuit bottoms or leggings and a red **logo** fleece.

New children's play area at Himley park now open!



We're thrilled to announce that our new woodland children's play area at Himley Hall and Park is now open!

"The highly anticipated play area at Himley Hall & Park is now open for children to enjoy, just in time for the school summer holidays."

Located near the former tennis courts and pavilion at the rear lefthand side of the hall, this immersive, natural-themed play area has lots of fun features for children and young people to enjoy.

Kids will be able to climb up a large wooden play tower and zoom down the spiral slide, spin around on rotating carousels, bounce on seesaws and rocking horses, and whizz down the zip line. There is also smaller equipment for toddlers to use.

In keeping with its leafy surroundings, this woodland play area is constructed using mostly timber with a mix of grassland, a loose mulch surface, and natural wood chip paths separating the various pieces of play equipment. It also echoes the history and architecture of Himley Hall through its play structures.

The play area is a perfect place for games and problem solving, making new friends, getting outdoors and experiencing the natural surroundings of Himley Park!

The installation of the play area follows a successful public consultation in 2021 and planning permission from South Staffordshire Council, whose boundaries cover the park.

Visitors to the park are welcome between 7.30am and dusk. Admission to the play area is free, but car parking charges apply.

Families visiting this summer will not only have the pleasure of the new play area, but the popular dinosaur and princess and pirate themed trails will return from Monday 22 July.

There's also the fairy 50 activity where children follow coordinates on a map in the search for 50 hidden fairy doors. This activity is available all year round.

Activity sheets for the activities will be available from the coffee lounge in the main hall.

The coffee lounge is open every day from 9.30am to 4pm and offers a range of refreshments, including hot and cold drinks, light lunches, and sweet treats.
