<u>Year 1</u>

This month Year 1 pupils visited Birmingham Botanical Gardens to investigate the glasshouse, identifying the different plants in the Tropical, Mediterranean, Japanese and Arid Greenhouse. We then looked at the conditions the plants needed to survive in each environment. We took part in an interactive plants workshop where they found out all about parts of the plants and how they reproduce. They acted out the important roles of the bees for transferring pollen and nectar to make honey and help in the reproduction. Well done to our little superstars.

Year 2

Year 2 had some very special visitors this month. Four firefighters came into school to tell us all about their very important job. We travelled back in time to 1666, to put out a 'fire' by passing a bucket of water down a long row of people before throwing the water on the 'fire.' We reflected on how much time it would take to put out all of the fires during the Great Fire of London and compared it to the resources that we have available today. The firefighters, Sarah and Peter, talked about how they use speaking, listening and teamwork skills in their role as firefighters. For example: Firefighters have to work as part of a team to keep each other safe. Each member of the team has an important job to do. It's important that each person does their part of the job so the whole job is done well. They also show each other respect, just like we do in school.





In science this term, we have been learning all about plants. We have enjoyed planting our own sunflower seeds and we are very excited to nurture them so they grow tall and healthy.


All of our year 2 children are fantastic readers. They have really enjoyed bringing their favourite stories into school to share with their friends during our reading for pleasure sessions this half term. We have listened to our friends talk about a range of different stories by many different authors. This has inspired us to broaden our book choices and enjoy texts by different authors.



Year 3/4

Our Year 3 and 4 pupils have loved being artists! They have taken inspiration from dragons and mythical creatures this half term! First, they created a mood board to gather their ideas and completed initial sketches. Second they built on their illustration unit in the Autumn term; using different gradings of pencil to add lightness/hardness and darkness/softness to add detail to their sketched eyes. Next, they have added detail through hatching, cross-hatching, scribbling, contouring and blending. Then, they have used clay to sculpt their eyes using a variety of clay tools. Finally, we will be painting them this week.







Year 5

Year 5 were invited to Perryfields High School for a 'flight day' to get a taste of what Secondary school life is like. The children were lucky enough to see a Falconry show, complete maths challenges, make paper aeroplanes and experience a trampolining session. The children had lots of fun throughout the day and the Teacher's at Perryfields were able to see just how amazing they all are!





On Thursday 28th June Year 5 went to Halesowen Town Hall to take part in an Aspirations afternoon. The children started by listening to a speaker and were then able to visit a variety of careers stalls. They could discuss and take home some freebies!
